- 1. Welcome and introductions: Designated Chair: Heloise Dixon-Warren
- 2. Empowering Family Health Stream 1 project completion:
 - Workshops now completed; successful
 - Evaluation Form Summary-Heloise says the process of compiling information is fairly straight forward.
 - Budget completion, collecting invoices from facilitator, communities and workshop leaders-target all cheques written before March 15, so budget completion is done by due date of March 31. Tara is working on purchasing the required supplies for the Parkland community school garden project, but is experiencing some difficulties with a number of Parkland Community Association members not available to sign cheques. She clarified the timeline and obtained offers for support from Sue and Colleen.
 - Review of final report going to Northern Health by committee members Heloise is reaching out to project participants to collect evaluations and working on her portion of the evaluation. Heloise will email workshop participants in regards to release for photos taken.
 - Melinda made comments on her experiences as a workshop leader and mentioned that it is important that equipment works and is adequate for the needs of the workshop. An example, is having enough heat for the pressure canning workshop, to get enough pressure and ensuring the power point projector/system works.
- 3. Empowering Family Health Stream 2 application review:
 - Comments on application and target goals- Grant approved; \$7500 for 2017 program
 - Timeline for target goals money available in April. News Release to go out.
 Discussion about the kitchens being used for the workshops in the communities.

 Kersley, Bouchie Lake and Wells are good. Parkland does not have access to the kitchen at this time. Tara said the goal is to have it accessible, but works needs to be done.
